CONTEÚDO: The course provides an overview of the economics of the minerals business with a focus on exploration aspects. The initial focus will be on the basic evaluation techniques required to assign value to mineral projects. Lecture material will be augmented by a range of international case studies and small group assignments that consider both individual project assessments and broader industry trends. All of the material will be presented in the context of investment decision making in the minerals business. Participants will be expected to be actively engaged in the course and make presentations and lead discussions of assignments and case studies.

PERFIL DO MINISTRANTE: Michael Doggett is an independent mineral economics consultant based in Vancouver, Canada. He has more than 25 years of experience in the mineral industry as an academic, consultant, project evaluator, entrepreneur, advisor and board member. He works with a range of clients on issues related to project evaluation and acquisition, mineral taxation, and industry exploration trends. He has provided training in mineral project assessment to more than 2000 professionals in a dozen countries. He currently serves as a Director of four public companies in Canada. His achievements have been recognized by the CIM who presented him with their Robert Elver Mineral Economics Award in 2002 and named him as a Distinguished Lecturer in 2010-2011 and by The SEG who named Dr. Doggett as their International Exchange Lecturer for the year 2005.
